RESULTS YOU CAN SEE

- It is anticipated that more than **5,000** MRI tests will be done in the first year of the machine's installation at HGH! These patients will no longer need to travel to Ottawa or Montreal to undergo an MRI.
- HGH conducts more than **10,000** CT scans per year on its current 16-slice machine. The new scanner will provide faster, more detailed 3D images, with a lower dose of radiation to the patient.
- The demand for MRI and CT scans will grow by **10-15 percent** per year! Having state-of-the-art diagnostic imaging equipment at the new HGH will serve our families, friends and colleagues for years to come.
- For patients visiting the Emergency Department who require a quick diagnosis by MRI or CT scan, this equipment will save lives!

PIERRE'S STORY

In the Fall of 2016, I was referred to a hospital in Ottawa for a Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) scan. At the time, I didn't realize this form of diagnostic imaging was not available in Hawkesbury, so imagine my shock when I received a call to inform me that my appointment would be in Ottawa at 1:30 a.m.!



I left Hawkesbury for my appointment at 11 p.m., as I had been asked to arrive with enough time to complete the necessary paperwork. Although my trip was traffic free at that time of the night, I arrived in a large parking lot at the Ottawa Hospital, completely confused and unsure of what entrance I was to use and where the clinic was located. After some time, I did manage to find my way and underwent the scan which took approximately 15 minutes. With a sigh of relief, I paid my \$13 parking fee, climbed back in my car, and drove the 1hr 20 minute return trip home.

I found the timing and long travel for this appointment very difficult and soon came to realize that this type of experience was not uncommon. In fact, thousands of people from our region are driving to Ottawa to receive an MRI, and many are scheduled for appointments in the middle of the night. I found myself wondering how someone less fortunate than I, without a vehicle and perhaps with mobility issues, would deal with such a predicament. I was able to drive myself to the appointment in good weather and am also in relatively good health, yet I still found this a challenge.

It is for this reason that I didn't hesitate to contribute to the HGH Foundation's current campaign to purchase an MRI machine and a new CT scanner for the Hawkesbury & District General Hospital. This will make a great difference in the quality of life of many in our region, who will soon be able to receive this treatment closer to home.
